OVERVIEW

Project Redemption (PR) is a member of the Evangelical Alliance - Israel (UCCI -www.ucci.net). PR's STREAMS program is a unique program which combines volunteer opportunities with life changing studies (please see page 2 for details).

STREAMS is not a complicated acronym, but simply an easy to remember name. Streams' philosophy is to give volunteers the opportunity to "Study" in this land which is rich on biblical sites, to "Serve" in a dynamic Arab society in order to create 'streams in the desert.'

Jerusalem - Ramallah: You will live and do office work in Jerusalem. The English & Computer Classes and the Café are in Ramallah, a 35 minute drive from Jerusalem (please see page 3 for details). The prerequisites are: 1. Fluency in English. 2. Ability to teach in a small group setting. 3. Love for hanging out with people.

Nazareth - "Can anything good come out of Nazareth?" We will see here how Jesus grew up when we visit "Nazareth Village" - www.nazarethvillage.com

Caesarea - Home of Cornelius the centurion. From his home the Gospel began to spread to the nations.

Samaria - Near today's Nablus (ancient Sichem) was the capital of the Northern Kingdom. We will visit the Samaritans who have remained here since ancient times.

Jaffa - (Joppa) Home of Simon the tanner. In Simon's home Peter receives his call to go to the Gentiles.

Timna Park - Solomon's copper mines were located here. Presently, it is an open air museum where a Christian organization has built a replica of the Tabernacle.

Eilat - Beautiful beach and a stunning underwater life. If you are a diver or want to become one then this is your opportunity

Banyas - Jesus revealed himself there by asking the question to his disciples: "Who do you think I am." Peter answered: "You are the Messiah the Son of the living God."

Tiberias - One of the pagan cities in the heartland of the Jewish people. Now predominately Jewish, also home of "Megavoice" - www.megavoice.com

Ramallah - Translated: "Hill of God," it is located between Bethel and Jerusalem. A pulsating city where we provide English and Computer courses.

Jerusalem - There is so much to see in the old part of Jerusalem: The Temple Mount, Western Wall, Gethsemane, Holy Sepulcher and the Garden Tomb. The new city is western and dynamic. You will be living on the Mt. of Olives.

Bethlehem - Birth place of Jesus. The oldest Church in the land is found here. Although predominantly Muslim, Bethlehem has a vibrant Evangelical community as well as the Bethlehem Bible College

Jericho - Jericho holds the distinction of "The oldest still inhabited in city in the world." It is also the lowest city with an elevation of 350 meters below sea level. We will see the ancient city, now in ruins.
