More than 2,500 people flooded to Gumaca National High School in the province of Quezon despite the rain showers. Men and women, young and old came to the "Himig ng Pag-asa" - (Hymn of Hope).

This event was organized by the churches coming from the 4th district of Quezon. Its sole purpose—to present the Gospel of salvation.

It was a night to talk about having a relationship with Jesus Christ. No religion is the answer to one's salvation. Jesus is the Only Way.

Song and dance numbers were presented. Testimony after testimony from Quezon Governor Rafael Nantes and Brother Anthony Roquel were heard, testified how the Lord Jesus Christ has changed their lives.

Governor Nantes shared how he came to know the Lord through his wife and how God has blessed him and his family when he pursued his public service.

Love and compassion compelled Jesus to minister to the poor and the helpless.

An evening after Jesus ministered to a large crowd, He told His disciples, "they do not need to go away. You give them something to eat," stated in Matthew 14:14-16.

EHCP showed compassion to one small remote village in Angono Rizal. High percentage among the children are unschooled. One or both parents are unemployed.

For them, there is no hope, there is no future. They need a hero to uproot them from this kind of life. These children's hope are placed on the hands of the heroes, who will give them food on the table, jobs for their parents, money to be



able to go to school, clothes to wear and houses to live in.

EHCP took part in sharing to them that there is Someone, "More than a Super Hero" whom they can put their trust into. The Gospel was presented to the children. Go bracelets were taught to them. Booklets—Jesus, More than a Superhero, were distributed and they were fed.

With the help of the volunteer workers, these children have heard the Gospel and that in Jesus, there is hope in the midst of life's difficulties.

Regular home Bible studies are being conducted to a few families and we believe that more homes will be opened.

"Let the little children come to me, ... for the kingdom of heaven belongs to such as these." - Matthew 19:14
