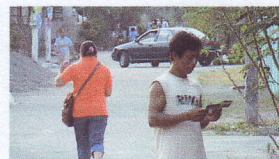


Reaching More Homes for Christ during Easter

May 2010 National & Local Elections

In the history of the Philippines, this is the first nation-wide fully automated elections.

With the efforts of the Commission on Elections way back in 1992, the automated process finally come to this point. From the selection of an appropriate technology, a pilot testing using the PCOS (Precinct Count Optical Scan) will be used on May 10, 2010.

The PCOS machine is the machine that will read and scan the ballots, count and print them and transmit the election results.

As a responsible citizen of this country, let us join our hearts and hands in prayer in exercising our right of suffrage. We need to be vigilant in selecting and voting for the capable and credible candidates to the national and local positions.
