Evangelical Leaders Conclude Historic Meetings in China

BEIJING, CHINA (ANS) -- A group of 24 leaders from seven regions of the world has concluded the World Evangelical Alliance's first official visit to China. According to a WEA media release, after spending time in Shanghai with the national leadership of the China Christian Council (CCC) and the National Committee of the Three-Self Patriotic Movement of the Protestant Churches in China (National Committee of the TSPM), the group left for Nanjing and Beijing.

The WEA's International Director Dr. Geoff Tunnicliffe commented in the media release: "Our team was impressed by the significant Bible printing operation which provides Scriptures for both the Chinese and international markets." The group was challenged and encouraged by the scope, depth and professionalism of the community services, development projects and humanitarian aid, the release said.

During the visit to Nanjing Union Theological Seminary (national seminary), the group was deeply encouraged by the vision of the graduate students. Gordon Showell-Rogers, WEA Associate International Director designate and current General Secretary of the European Evangelical Alliance stated:"The love of this group of young men and women for their Lord and His word, and for their country and people, was tangible, even through translation."

Finally, the group traveled to Beijing, to meet local church leaders and government officials. The WEA delegation was warmly received by leaders of the State Administration for Religious Affairs, who spoke of the government's desire to see Christians contributing more and more to social welfare programs. The WEA leaders were able to explain something of the character and values of global evangelicalism.

Bishop Gerry Seale, General Secretary of the Evangelical Association of the Caribbean described how these leaders explained their context. He remarked: "In their fast-changing situation, the growing church in China is facing the challenge of continuing to grow their own pastoral and leadership training to equip believers to serve their churches and the broader needs of society."

As the trip drew to a close, Mr. Showell-Rogers concluded that the "WEA had gained some new perspectives on the church in this complex and huge nation." On Sunday morning Dr. Tunnicliffe brought greetings on behalf of WEA at the famous, Chongwenmen Church in Beijing, where over 7500 people attend the services.

Dr. Tunnicliffe summed up the historic weeklong visit by saying: "As Chinese friends said to us several times: 'every journey starts with one small step.' Our long-term commitment in China is to build on these first small steps for the good of the church worldwide."

The World Evangelical Alliance is made up of 128 national evangelical alliances located in 7 regions and 104 associate member organizations. The vision of WEA is to extend the Kingdom of God by making disciples of all nations and by Christ-centered transformation within society. WEA exists to foster Christian unity, to provide an identity, voice and platform for the 420 million evangelical Christians worldwide.

Joel C. Rosenberg writes:

My wife and kids lived in the Middle East for 3 months during which time I was able to interview more than three dozen Arab and Iranian pastors and evangelical leaders throughout the region. This is what I learned;

Iraq: More than 5000 new M converts have been identified since the end of major combat operations. 14 new churches in Baghdad, dozens in Kurdistan, some of which have 500 to 800 members. More than 1,000,000 Bibles shipped into Iraq since 2003. They are eagerly snatched up.

Egypt: It is estimated that 1,000,000 have trusted Christ during the last decade. The Egyptian Bible Society used to sell 3,000 copies of the Jesus film a year in the early 1990s. But are now selling 600,000 per year, plus 750,000 copies of the Bible on tape in Arabic and about 500,000 copies of the Arabic New Testament. The largest Christian congregation in the Middle East meets in huge cave on the outskirts of Cairo. Some 10,000 worship there every weekend. A prayer conference drew 20,000

Afghanistan: In 2001 there were est. 17 M converts, but now there are more than 10,000 - dozens of Baptism every week. Kazakhstan: In 1990 there were only 3 known Christians. But now more than 15,000. Uzbekistan: No known Christian in 1990. Now more than 30,000. Sudan: More than 1,000,000 converted since 2000, in spite of M genocide of over 200,000.

NZ Marine Reach Ship Tour – Matt Dawson

PACIFIC LINK: The ship has had several thousand students through the ship across the various ports. Still going strong. The feedback from the local pastors has been fantastic. Here's what one in New Plymouth had to say:

On behalf of the New Plymouth Christian Leaders Network, may I express ... our deepest appreciation... the Marine Reach Ministries Ship Pacific Link into Port Taranaki last week. ... the ship had a fantastic



week of connection with the community of New Plymouth. The school staff and children found the experience exceptional.

The teams are continuing to visit schools and churches around the country. In many cases they've had as many as 50 people coming forward for prayer after sharing the call to missions. They've connected with quite a few Maori teenagers, which is something we've been particularly hoping God would open the doors for. Many of them have felt a strong stirring to break out of the usual and dive into God's plan for their life. Woohoo!!!

Nigerian Heroes of Faith

October 4, 2009, Port Harcourt, Nigeria.

I can't give more than a summary, but we are seeing a move of God in a way we have not seen before here in Nigeria. The militants you have heard about the past few years on TV news have been armed with the latest weapons, bombs, etc. and have kidnapped lots of people, especially foreigners. Three of them came to the YWAM campus this week.



Saturday, October 3, we dedicated a branch campus nearby, for a Teacher Training School within the *University of the Nations*, being provided by "The Fellowship" of intercessors who read *Is That Really You, God?* in 1992 and prayed for 10 years for YWAM to come to this city. Paul _____ and I visited here in 2002, looking for a place for a base and stayed at the home of this godly woman who leads these intercessors. Now, seven years later, with ten training bases established throughout Nigeria, we marvel at answered prayer.

The new branch land in Port Harcourt has beautiful grounds, an auditorium for 1,500, plus a fountain, an orphanage, and they will soon have the prototype primary school built for teacher training.

We have another great campus up north; in fact, we have five YWAM locations in the {M} north of Nigeria! Taliban-trained militants were sent from Iran to this region and two months ago, they marched to within 300 yards of one of our YWAM campuses, wielding destruction all along the way. They were blood-thirsty, having already burned 27 Christian churches in the area, some with people inside (we have seen heart-wrenching photos taken by YWAMers of charred bodies of martyrs in burned-out churches, plus mass graves). Approximately 1,000 Christians were killed within a few hours.

God protected our very brave YWAMers. The army stopped the Taliban just 300 yards before they could burn us out. They would behead Christians who would not "renounce Jesus." Their goal is to take over Nigeria, the largest (160 million population) and the most oil rich nation in Africa, to make it a {M} nation.

The Nigerian President is a {M} though 45% of the population is Christian, and 35% is Moslem, the rest animist. The stakes are high: *as Nigeria goes, so goes the continent*. We are at the forefront of the the conflict, and can report that Jesus is winning...but the war is not over. Much prayer is needed and re-enforcements.

In the south, the "Christian" area, where I first ministered in 1961 when it was peaceful, there are now thousands of militants—mostly university students who became angry and bitter against corruption and injustice and turned to guerilla warfare. They have grown stronger over the last decade, to the point that they, not the government, have had the upper hand controlling much wealth, land and weapons. The militants sell one-fifth of the nation's oil supply on the black market to nations needing cheaper oil, to pay for their war.

The YWAM Discipleship Training School (DTS) outreach that concluded September 30th, after much prayer, knew God was leading them on outreach to the camps of the militants who were killing, kidnapping bombing, using grenade-launchers, etc.

Into the camps went the YWAMers, prayed up, ready to die or see God's power. They saw God's power! One of the most ruthless murderers, armed with a large knife, approached the YWAMers with his knife poised over his head. The other militants had witnessed that when he went into this demonic rage, he didn't stop until he had killed someone, so they said to the YWAMers "run!" The school leader, Alex, said "no," and started walking toward the man. Alex spoke firmly but calmly "you need Jesus." Over and over he said it, as he drew closer to the drawn knife's point. The man replied "No! Run or you die!" When Alex was just a few feet away, the man fell to his knees, threw down his weapon and wept. He was saved and delivered, as were many others. Many of the militants had made oaths with Satan. One would go into a trance... until the demons were appeased.

One YWAM staff member was one of the boldest, but most blunt in his preaching. He told the militants that they were going to hell if they didn't repent. Now he is one of the most trusted by the militants...and the government and the police! Just this past Sunday, H____ brought in another huge cache of weapons and bombs, etc. to hand over to the government military, given up by the former militants. Even the militant commanders have started encouraging several to go to YWAM, because they are coming to believe and trust that God can bring justice when they or the government cannot. 300 former militants just went through a YWAM three-week training course. Another 600 will start into a second course soon. A large percentage gave their hearts to Christ, many after demonic deliverances, and 69 are signed up for the January 2010 DTS.

Three of these former militants gave their testimonies at the YWAM DTS. All of the above has been happening in just the last few days and weeks. As one of them shared, he looked over at Dar and me and said, "My job was to kidnap white people." He smiled. But he said, "I wasn't rehabilitated, I was transformed by the power of God." They have enough stories of God in action, over the past few weeks to fill books. God is being glorified.

This is such a huge breakthrough! We have a new mission base in the big village controlled by the militants. The Governor of Rivers State was so happy, along with the national government, and with the churches, all saying the same thing: they want three YWAM bases in each of the 36 states of Nigeria. Pray for laborers.

The Governor said publicly, "what guns and bullets could not do, God's power has done." He was so grateful to YWAM, he sent his Protocol Officer to meet Darlene and me when we arrived at the airport, to invite us to stay at the Governor's mansion. We declined, saying that we needed to live with the participants coming to the Leadership Training Course at YWAM. So he sent his car with armed police escorts, with sirens and lights flashing, and brought us to the YWAM campus. (We were too busy with the LTC to go anywhere until Sunday, when we went to a few Sunday services to preach—in a car borrowed from a YWAMer.)

The local YWAM leaders have launched their *first International Missions Conference* held at the auditorium on campus October 8, 9 & 10 with leaders attending from Nigeria and more than 20 other nations.

Never let it be said that the life of a YWAMer is boring! Dar and I spoke in different parts of the city to packed churches. We're tired but very fulfilled. Who would think we could be in such an exciting place at such an exciting time as this!

STOP PRESS

October 7, 2009. The three top militant commanders just surrendered to government authorities and now 2,000 more of their followers!

The situation with the militants is still front-page news. The top three militants surrendered themselves to the government authorities in the last few hours. Yesterday one of the former commanders came to the base to visit -- he has had a transformational experience with the Lord. With the surrender of the top leaders, 2,000 more young militants have been released. As with the previous 900 militants who have "come out," the government will probably be asking YWAM to "rehabilitate them." Their testimonies too reveal such darkness, satanic covenants, murders--the worst of the worst. But when they come to Jesus and get set free, they speak of freedom with such gratitude! -- Loren

MI AGM Report

The MI 09 AGM was held on 17 November at St Margaret's Anglican Church, Hillsborough. Chairman Wayne Freeman opened with a welcome, a devotional from Hebrews 13, and prayer. Minutes of the 08 AGM were approved.

The Chairman's and Director's Reports were circulated, discussed and approved. The Financial Statements for the year ended 30 June 2009 which had had an *Independent Financial Review* were presented and adopted.

We had twelve prior nominations for the next Council three year term, with only six positions available. Voting was done by secret ballot and tabulated by three approved scrutinizers.

Mobilisation, Jamie Wood gave an update on the Koroutahi Manifesto and the Destination World "edutainment" experience. *Destination World: the Call* conference, 1-4 September 2010, focused on 16 to 30 year olds, was presented. Jamie gave an update on the mission web site being developed to serve the NZ missions community.

David Hall shared about a significant expansion of the **Bulk Purchasing Program** in collaboration with the largest Christian-based bpp in NZ. This *could* double the BPP benefits MI members already enjoy. This could also be tied in with a special *Associate Membership* (no voting rights) enabling MI to better serve more of the Christian community with an interest in missions and increase the negotiating leverage of our bulk purchasing program.

James Muir spoke briefly on the upcoming *Call2All Next Generation* conference next month in Tauranga.

The meeting was followed by an informal lunch and fellowship.
