### "World Bibles" Site Indexes Over 16,000 Int'l Bibles

The new "World Bibles" web site, just released by Wycliffe Associates UK, will help immigrant populations to find Bibles in their own languages. Resources are listed for hundreds of languages, including printed Bibles, Scripture cassettes, CDs, on line Bible text, downloadable Bibles, and films. Visitors to the site simply type in a language name. A list appears showing known Bible resources available in that language. Since the site is an index, it provides links to existing sites on the Internet, but it does not offer any specific Bibles. The Call to All

working together to fulfill the Great Commission



It all began at "Amsterdam 2000" the Billy Graham conference in August of that year. Eight thousand evangelists were in the main venue, but a smaller group of us were working behind the scenes on key questions related to finishing the Great Commission.

The Graham organization had selected about 400 leaders from across the Body of Christ representing many nations to deal with this one issue: "What would it take to finish the Great Commission?" We dealt with many questions over a period of days, but one day was like no other.

We were all sitting at tables selected by the organizers. I was sitting at table number 71 next to Steve Douglass (who had just become president of Campus Crusade for Christ). We were handed sheets listing the "untargeted, unreached people groups" in the world over 100,000 in size. These as far as anyone knew had never been engaged on any level with the gospel. Of course these groups were in the hardest places, locations often dangerous to any missionaries.

Paul Eshleman and Bruce Wilkerson stood on stage together and challenged all of us. Paul said, "It's not right that these groups are left unreached while so many have a Christian witness all around them." Bruce followed by saying, "No one should be untargeted, this is disobedience to the Great Commission." He then challenged us to adopt the remaining groups.

The environment in the room was electric. Christian leaders of all kinds began to stand to their feet and shout out their commitment to particular people groups. Some took one, others took two or three. It was one of the most faith filled moments I have witnessed in my ministry life.

Then it all stopped...

Half way through the commitments no one else stood. Everyone was looking around thinking "Whose next? It can't stop like this!" I was staring down at the people group list struggling with the possibility of my own commitments. I work with Youth With A Mission, I was thinking, "I can't do anymore, I am already too busy." At that moment Steve Douglass leaned over to me and said, "Why don't our two organizations take the rest?"

CCCI and YWAM commit to the rest of the list? Taking responsibilities for all of these groups, would that be possible?

Now my mind was really racing... I couldn't speak for all of YWAM. We were already involved with unreached people groups, but this was a specific commitment to the hardest groups in the world. Even though my mind was saying no, my Spirit was shouting yes! I leaned back over to Steve and said, "Ok, let's do it!" When I said those words a supernatural peace from the Holy Spirit flooded my heart.

The next thing that happened caught me totally by surprise. Steve sent a message to the stage that, "Campus Crusade for Christ and Youth With A Mission would make a commitment to adopting the rest of the list." Everyone stood and started cheering as Bruce made the announcement. I was thinking, "What have I done?"

What happened next was so supernatural I wish it would have been videotaped...  $[Zero-Part\ 1]$ 

[Zero - Part 2] Something supernatural happened next, the 400 Christian leaders were dismissed for a coffee break. Steve Douglass and I stayed seated at our table thinking about the magnitude of the commitment we just made on behalf of our two organizations. We had just committed to "reach" half of the untargeted people groups in the world.

"Steve, what does reach mean?" I said. He jumped right in on the answer, "We know we need the bible, we have to have the scriptures translated into the local languages. The one who does most of that is Wycliffe." Just as Steve said this,

Roy Peterson, who was then the president of Wycliffe, walked up to the table just like he was on cue. "Roy," "How would you like to join our discussion and help us get scripture to all of these people groups?" Roy smiled and said, "I'm in," and sat down.

Steve continued, "Certainly we need church planting. Wouldn't it be great if someone from the international missions board (IMB) for the SBC could be part of this group? They are doing a tremendous work using church planting movements." At that very moment Avery Willis, senior leader with IMB, walked up to the table. "Avery, we were just talking about you guys," Steve said. "Could you help with church planting movements in these unreached people groups?" "I'm in," Avery responded. He then pulled up a chair and sat down at table 71.

"We will need research on the various church planting movements around the world, wouldn't it be great if DAWN could help us?" I said. At that moment the president of DAWN tapped on my shoulder and said, "Could I join this discussion?"

In just a few minutes time we had at the table representation from one of the top church planting organizations, the President of the largest scripture translation ministry, representation from the two largest missions organizations and the premiere church planting research group. Over the next ten minutes several other main leaders joined us, including Bruce Wilkinson, who was then the head of Walk Through The Bible.

We all knew that God was up to something significant.

Over the next couple days this group continued to meet at any chance we could. Steve and I worked on a missions statement for this new group, passing notes back and forth across the table. By the second day of our discussions, we decided we needed a name for this new partnership of ministries. None of us wanted a high profile; we were already part of large organizations. It was then that I looked at the sign on our table, which simply had the number 71 on it. The Graham organization had numbered all 100 tables so we could be easily organized.

"Why don't we call ourselves table 71, no one will know what that is?" I said. Immediately everybody liked that idea, little did we know all that God had in mind.

All this happened in August of 2000. The next year we began to meet 3 times a year. Table 71 grew and added more partners. Over these last 9 years God has nit us together in ways that we wouldn't have thought possible. Some of the major initiatives of our time are coming out of the ministries that are part of this fellowship of leaders. Including new research on UUPGs (Unengaged unreached people groups), new mapping strategies, oral bible initiatives and many elements of the Call2All movement.

One of the dreams of Table 71 is the number "Zero". The idea that there would be no unengaged, unreached people groups left. This is not an original idea, it began with Jesus. We see it in one of the key statements of the bible:

"And this gospel of the kingdom will be preached in the whole world as a testimony to all nations and then the end will come." Matthew 24:14 NIV

The Greek word used for nations in this scripture is "ethnos" which means tribe, race or people groups.

In my next report I will share with you one of the most amazing progress reports in world missions of our time. Look for *Zero Part 3*.
