Tikapur Leadership Training Institute

The 5th batch of the Tikapur Leadership Training started from 4th Aug 2009 with 5 men and 6 women. The students represented different denominations such as Agape, Alpha, Full Gospel, AG and National Churches Fellowship of Nepal from 4 different districts of Mid and Far West Nepal. The students have learnt subjects like leadership, Biblical Preaching, Bible Study Method, Relig-



ion, the Church, Mission and Evangelism, Bible Survey, Spiritual Formation, etc. Along with regular quiet times in the morning, Bible study in the evenings, and Bible verse memorization everyday, students also completed reading of the whole Bible within the 4 months. During the five-day outreach program they went to 3 villages and shared the Gospel with 1500 people.

In the first week of the training one student had to leave the training centre due to sickness.

Graduation was held on 4th Dec. Pastor Prem Narayan Adhikari challenged the students to follow Jesus' footprints by sitting at His feet. One of the students, Mr. Pyare Lal Chaudhary, astonished participants by reciting 79 verses within 10 minutes.



Five years ago I suffered from Typhoid and Malaria while working in India. I could not go through treatment since I did not have enough money and I came back home. When I returned home I found that my family had become Christians. I took medicine but could not be healed. Then, I asked my elder brother to pray for me. He asked me to believe Him before he prays. Then I accepted Jesus in to my life as my Lord and Savior and got healed. By seeing leadership quality leaders of my Church sent me to Tikapur Leadership Training Centre in 2008 where God confirmed my call to His vineyard. One day at the training centre I was watching Nick's film I was challenged by his preaching who has no hands and no legs. If he can do such great things for the Lord then why can't I do it? A thought provoked my mind. I have been helping my Church in youth fellowship and also preach in the church in the absence of my elder brother who is leader of the Church.

Christian Leadership Training Centre, Butwal, West Nepal

The 2nd batch of CLTC started on 20th Sep. with 16 students from different parts of west Nepal and different church groups. However, three of the students had to drop because of health problems. Most of the students were mature leaders, but without any formal training. Some of them have even completed Bachelor-level studies.

Students have learnt very practical subjects such as Bible Survey, Leadership, Basic Doctrines, Biblical Counselling, Bible Study Method, Comparative Religions, Personal Spiritual Growth, Church, Mission and Evangelism and Church History.

They have spent quiet times and participated in group-devotions every morning and Bible study every evening,



as well as completing the reading of the whole Bible during this training. The last week of October, students went to two different districts of West Nepal for outreach, and shared the gospel with 500 people. They had to walk up to 3 hours to reach the area, after several hours travel by bus. The graduation was held on 18th Dec in which the General Secretary of NCF Nepal challenged the graduating students from God's Word and awarded them with certificates.



I came to Christ 5 years ago and have been serving in the Church ever since. I had an opportunity to go to CLTC in Butwal with a friend from our Church. Before coming to the training, I did not know how to expound the Bible or what a leader should be like.

Now I can preach the Word of God in the right way. Believers in our Church are growing in the Lord spiritually and the number also has been increasing. I am encouraging those who are going through persecution and trying to get back those who have backslidden.

Women Leadership Training



The 9th session of the Women's Leadership Training was completed 15 Dec. Once again women gathered from different rural areas of the country for one month of learning and experiences.

This time there were 11 women from 5 different districts. There were quite a few contrasts in the students this time: illiterate to Class 12 graduates; unmarried, married, and abandoned wives; quite new Christians to '14-15 year olds' in the Lord; daughters of previous graduates and Christian families, to the only two believers in the whole village. It was truly a way to experience the diversity of the Body of Christ and the added blessings of learning from each other and definitely growing together. The month was filled to the brim with classes, study, hands-on activities, and practical experiences.

As the women shared about their learning a common thread was a new appreciation, understanding, and ability to read and study the Bible- something that most had little experience with previously. Students were especially encouraged to consider practical application of the teaching for their lives, their families, and their own churches.

Women Leadership Seminar

omen from 12 different churches gathered for a 3day seminar organized by Bardia Area Community



No. 3 in Bardiya District of Mid West Nepal from 15-17 Sept.. LTD provided the teaching and materials for the 40-50 participants. The women were challenged in areas of Personal Spiritual Growth and Discipleship, their Roles in the Family and Church, and Interpersonal Relationships. One of the organizing pastors later expressed his opinion that from now on they would have 'seminars' rather than 'conventions' because of the concrete impact of these days. Another pastor has reported a real healing of friction among the women in their church related to the seminar.

Relationship Restored

Sunita came to Women leadership training in June 2009 from Palpa, West Nepal. She shares her life before training with these words: I used to quarrel with my husband. I didn't help my husband in ministry. I even didn't attend some of the

church meetings. One year ago she was in a position to separate from her husband.

Now Sunita has been supporting her husband in the ministry. She realizes her role as a wife to understand her husband and support

her by all means. Now she is happy with her husband. she is leading house fellowships and worship services on Saturdays.

Her husband Indra testifies, "Sunita, my wife, used to quarrel with me even for small matters before the training. Now she has been going with me in the ministry whenever required." Bishnu, Sunita's Pastor, who encouraged her to go to this training is very grateful to leadership Training Department. He has also witnessed restored relationship between Sunita and her husband.


his year LTD, in partnership with the Churches in the far west hill region organized a 4-day seminar from 16-20 Nov. in Dadeld-

"I have learnt the value of working in a team and I have decided to raise 4 leaders from my Church to work with me. The teaching on stewardship has really touched me. I have set up a goal to plant 3 fellowships in three villages within a year as a result of this seminar."
